OUR PROJECTS AND ENGAGEMENT



Titanic Belfast

Completed in 2012, the iconic visitor attraction has welcomed over 75 million visitors from 145 countries and contributed more than £430 million* to the local economy.



H&W Drawing Offices

Now restored and transformed into Titanic Hotel Belfast, the stunning drawing offices showcase Harland & Wolff's skill and craftsmanship.



SS Nomadic

The largest RMS Titanic artefact in the world, the SS Nomadic has attracted nearly 2 million visitors since restoration work was completed in 2013.



Artefacts

We've built up a collection of hundreds of artefacts donated by former shipyard employees and the local community that is displayed in a free Out of Stores exhibition.



Great Light

One of the largest lighthouse optics ever constructed, the Great Light is over 130 years old and now illuminates the Titanic Walkway.



SoundYard

A playful art installation inspired by the sounds of Belfast's shipyards. It is located on Queen's Quay close to the Odyssey and Abercorn Marina.



RiverBox

A unique cultural venue and multipurpose art installation. Equipped with cutting edge video and audio technology, RiverBox hosts media installations, interactive projects, and events.



Local Engagement

Through our destination work, we've engaged with over 510,000 people from 400 community groups and schools and supported and worked with 145 partner organisations and businesses.



Story Plan

The history of Belfast's waterfront is not one story but many stories, from the smallest beginnings to the greatest endeavours. These stories are not consigned to the past but are still alive in maritime Belfast which is why we developed the Maritime Belfast Story Plan.

The Plan identifies key themes, supported by storylines and maps highlighting the relevant heritage sites. Some of the heritage is tangible but much has disappeared. Maritime Belfast is committed to preserving what is left and where it has disappeared, we look at opportunities to restore the heritage through innovative interpretation and design.


Maritime Mile


Waterfront **Promenade Framework**

Working with key landowners and stakeholders along the waterfront and Copenhagen architects Schulze + Grassov, we have established the Waterfront Task Group to create a framework for future developments along the water's edge: Embracing the Belfast Waterfront

The Waterfront Promenade project is an important opportunity to encourage and harmonise new sustainable development on the waterfront. The promenade will

create a high-quality environment for existing communities, new residential and commercial development, and will serve as a major visitor gateway.

The framework details our ambition for a Belfast waterfront that is greater than the sum of its parts. includes a toolkit of interventions and a number of key projects. By balancing community, nature and development, a world class waterfront will emerge over time.
